

Renaissance Summative Assignment

You will create a 4 slide PowerPoint presentation on one person who made contributions to culture during the Renaissance. The most important thing you will do is tell what impact the person had on culture and why we should learn about it.

Slide 1 - introducing the person

- . Name and picture
- . Where we're they from
- . What summarize what their "job" was. In other words, what did they do (writer, artist, sculptor, architect)

Slide 2 - Highlight their most important accomplishment

- . Explain what the person did and name their important works.
- . Why is this an important accomplishment?
- . Photos

Slide 3 - How does this person represent the Renaissance?

Remember that the Renaissance is the rebirth of Greek and Roman culture. It is also a new interest in the SECULAR world.

- . Explain how the person represent the secular world.
- . Explain how the person is part of the Renaissance

Slide 4 - Other - what else do we need to know about this person?

- . Photos, maps
- . At least 3 bullets or sentences
- . Make it relevant

People

Botticelli - Painted Birth of Venus and other scenes from classical mythology also noted for his Madonnas

Brueghel - Painted lively scenes of village life

Descartes - Described a new method of inquiry in which all thought would follow the orderly progression of scientific reasoning

Durer - noted for copper engravings and woodcuts

Erasmus - Dutch humanist

Eleanor of Aquitaine - Queen of France and England, Crusader and patron of the arts

Gutenberg -Invented the moveable type

Hildegarde of Bingen - mystical seer, abbess, poetess, singer and composer

Luther, Martin - Protested against the Catholic church's use of indulgences and the corruption of the church; challenged the church by posting 95 thesis on the church door

Raphael - Artist noted for his Madonnas

Sir Thomas More - Wrote "Utopia" which described both social problems and possible solutions

Titian - His works noted for very rich colors

Vesalius - conducted investigations to see how the human body was constructed
